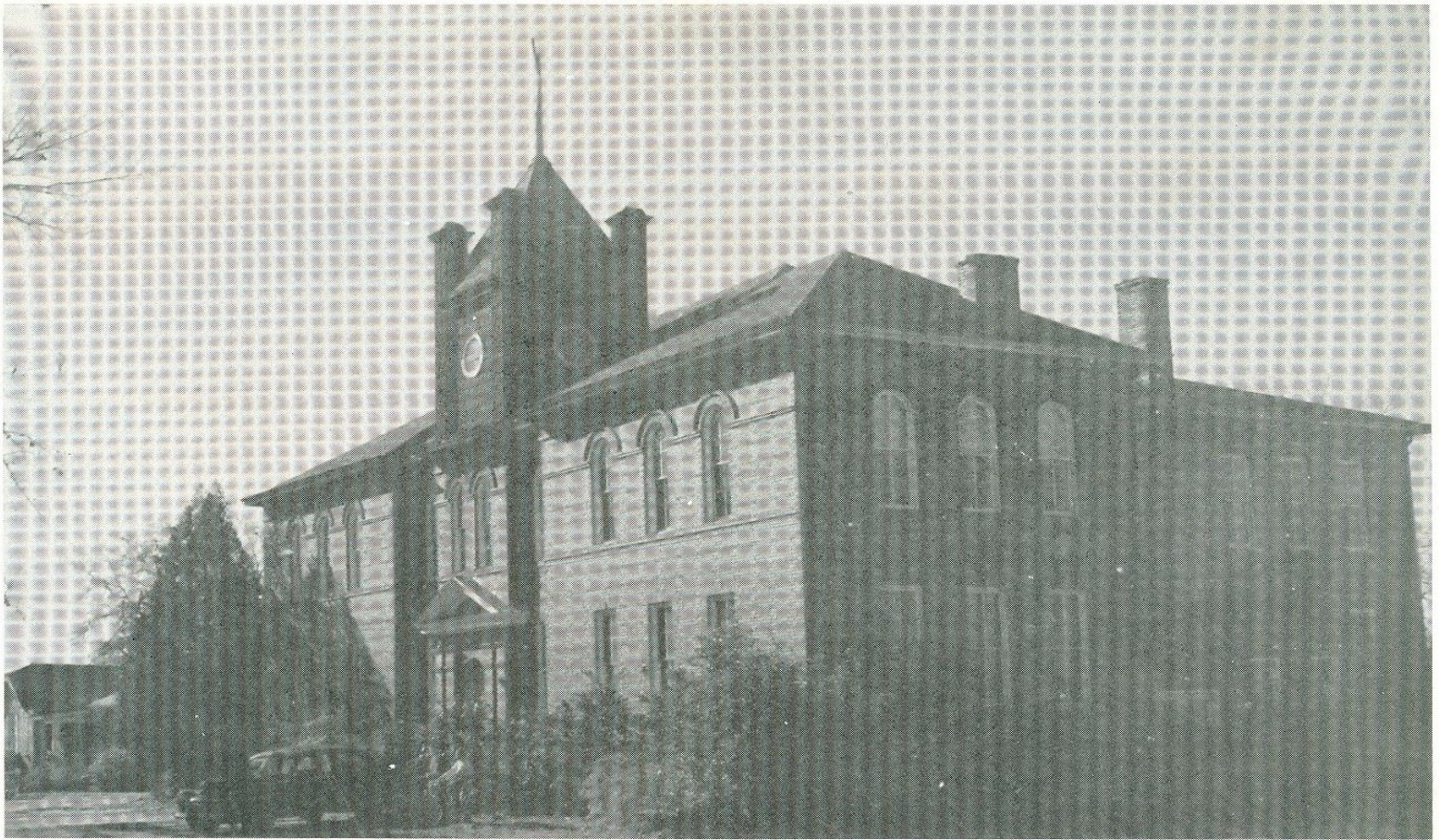

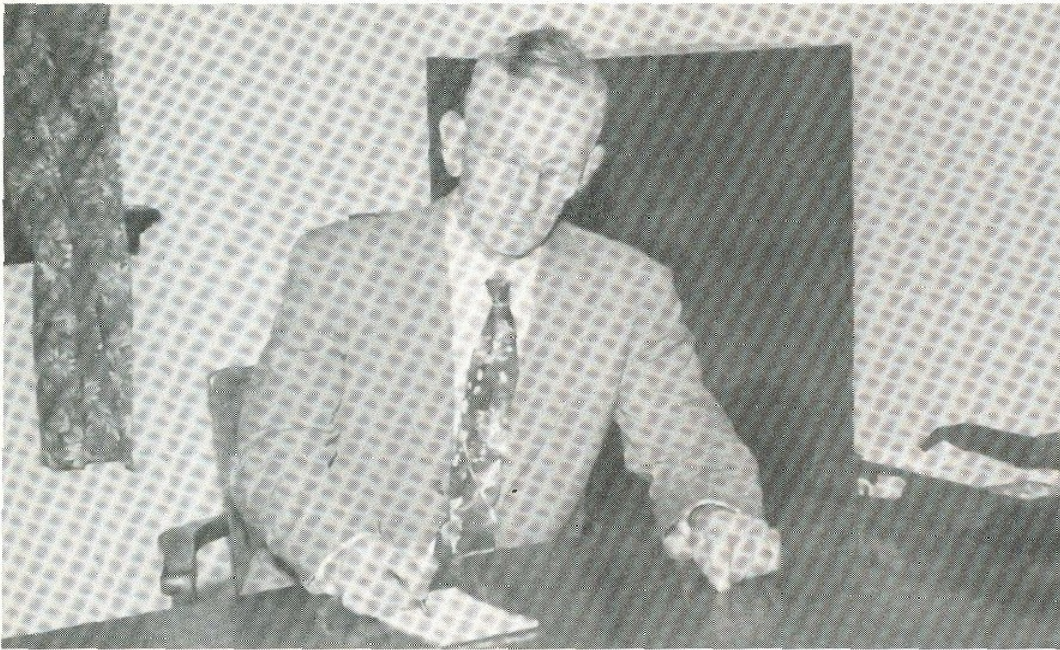
Faithful and true-hearted,
